Report of the Managed Care and Employment Task Force

Wisconsin's innovative Family Care program assists people with disabilities in reaching their goals for where and how they live, including assisting with community employment.

To implement the most effective employment assistance possible, the Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services assembled the Managed Care and Employment Task Force (MCETF). **Members of the public will have an opportunity at listening sessions around the state to offer their thoughts about the Family Care employment service plan as developed by the MCETF.**

The Task Force has completed its draft final report and recommendations and welcomes public comments and feedback.

The charge to the Task Force was to develop a blueprint for a comprehensive strategy that:

- Will support and advance the four key values of Wisconsin's managed long-term care system:
 - choice
 - access
 - quality, and
 - cost-effectiveness.
