After the \$140 deductible is met, beneficiaries are responsible for 20% co-pay of Medicare approved amount and Medicare pays 80% of Medicare approved amount for most services.		
Medicare Part D Cost-Sharing:		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <100% FPL w/ full subsidy pay \$1.10 co-pay on generics and \$3.30 on brand names • >100% pay with full subsidy: \$2.60 co-pay on generics and \$6.50 on brand names • Partial subsidy eligibles (135-150% FPL) will pay 15% of cost of drugs • Medicare Part D cost-sharing will be determined by individual plan, but must meet "actuarial equivalent" set by CMS • After \$320 (if any) deductible met, beneficiary pays about 25% of drug costs until total drug costs reach \$2,930, when the donut hole starts. • After total drug costs reach \$2,930, beneficiary pays 100% of generic drug costs and 50% of brand names until the amount beneficiary paid out of pocket + 50% brand name discounts reach approx. \$4,700, when donut hole ends. • After donut hole ends, beneficiary pays about 5% of drug costs (\$2.60-\$6.50 for each prescription)
